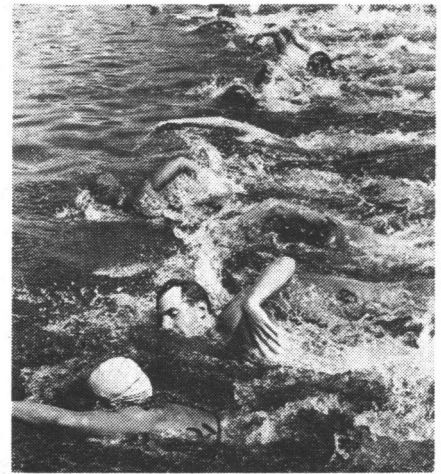

Glen Hummer Long Distance Championships

The 10th Annual Glen S. Hummer Masters Mile race was held in Lake Clare near Huntington, Indiana, on August 2, 1980. Seventy-five swimmers from all parts of the United States were there to test their endurance in the open water swim. When it was all over Jeff Cooke (35-39) of West Lafayette Indiana had taken overall honors with a time of 23:06.25. Finishing two seconds behind him in 23:08.65 was John Shrum (30-34) from Charlottesville, Virginia. Melissa Ward (25-29) of Washington Township was the first woman finisher in the Masters division with a time of 26:55.38.

Many swimmers stayed on at Lake Clare to enter the Masters National Two-Mile Championship the following day. Spectators cheered as Cooke and Shrum went at it again -- and this time Shrum was the victor. His time was 47:39.48, and Cooke posted a close 47:44.50. Helen Buss (40-44) of St. Louis, Missouri, was the first woman to finish. Her very respectable time was 47:44.50.

These Masters distance meets were held in conjunction with the 23rd Annual Glen S. Hummer Age-Group Mile and the Senior National Four-Mile Championship. As is usually the case when age-group and senior-level

swimmers get together with the "old" Masters, a good time was had by all.
