### Community events off the pool deck:

We held 2 Socials that were not connected to meets or any other events; one in Chicago and one downstate in Bloomington. The board paid for the food and drinks, and both were attended by at least 2 members of the board and between 20-30 swimmers and coaches. We also held our annual social after the Saturday session of the state meet. This is where our annual awards are handed out, Hall of Fame announced, and food and drink is provided. This event was attended by about 150 people.

### Financial health: as of mid-year, \$17,600 in bank and \$265,600 in investments

Volunteers: Steady, dedicated volunteers are still going strong. We have one previously very active volunteer who is very sick and we have covered his duties with current board members. We have begun to find permanent replacements and are working hard to recruit new volunteers to serve in these roles.

Volunteers projected to attend Relay: We are having a hard time finding volunteers who have the time to travel to this event. Still working on this list. National Coaches Clinic: We are currently taking scholarship applications and hope to fund at least 3 coaches at 100% for this clinic.

**National Coaches Clinic:** We are currently taking scholarship applications and hope to fund at least 3 coaches at 100% for this clinic.

### Ideas/Goals for 2025:

Focus on helping teams who have the capabilities to run an ALTS program (certified instructors, pool space) get it off the ground. We often have coaches interested in the certification but then don't actually start an ALTS program.

Work on spending down our surplus for the good of the LMSC. We would love to hold a banquet as others have described.

# 3. Indiana: Total Membership: 1146

### Total Clubs: 21

<u>Swim Meets</u>: 2 sanctioned meets and **one** recognized meet. Additionally, we had USMS approve sanctions for Spring Nationals and College Club Nationals in Indiana. We are expecting at least two more sanction requests for meets this fall.

<u>ALTS</u>: I believe we have **2** ALTS programs in Indiana (Indy and Zionsville), though I am still waiting to hear back specifics on this. <u>Try Masters Swimming</u>: no information

<u>Group events:</u> We hosted a Pentathlon meet this Spring that was followed by a social with a Paralympic guest speaker. We had 56 swimmers from 13 teams at the meet, and over 35 people join us at the restaurant afterwards for the social. I can only personally speak to Indy Aquatic Masters in terms of team events off the pool deck, but we have a few - namely Swimcation, our Spring Training Trip down in Fort Lauderdale, FL. We

also have weekly Saturday brunch after practice, and an annual end of summer party with music and food.

<u>Financial health</u>: Currently sitting at a surplus as our account has grown since Covid, with an increased budget this year for Club Development, ALTS scholarships, as well as for stipends to teams hosting a new meet.

<u>Recruiting Volunteers for LMSC roles:</u> We have two new members of the board this year and have regularly had 1-2 additional non-board GRIN members at our board meetings who have been eager to get involved however they can. So for now, in a good spot for LMSC volunteers.

<u>Volunteers projected to attend Relay</u>: TBD still, I anticipate possibly Faith Tocco (Hyde), Rosalie Fidanze, Mike Carlson, Lisa Brown, or Rachel Rivera as potentials if you're looking for names.

Coaches projected to attend NCC: ??

<u>Ideas/Goals for 2025</u>: Increase transparency about how the board is here to help (we know of a few people who want to host meets but didn't know that they should be talking to us about it for sanctioning or anything), increase club development spending - create a new swimmer gift with a GRIN cap or tshirt for new members, have at least one new meet sanctioned (working with a team who has never hosted a meet but wants to), research where our unattached swimmers are located and if it's reasonable to start a new team or revive a team that didn't survive covid, Survey our club reps and coaches to see how we can support financially or otherwise.

### Introduction

The Northwest Zone covers an area of 1,175,954 square miles, which includes all of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and 3 counties in Nevada. The zone's seven LMSCs are Alaska (AK), Inland NW (IW), Montana (MT), Oregon (OR), Pacific NW (PN), Snake River (SR), and Utah (UT). The NW Zone currently lists 90 USMS members serving on the various LMSC leadership teams.

The board conducts zoom calls in December, March, and June, in addition to the annual meeting associated with USMS's annual meeting. Increased membership is happening throughout the NW Zone. As of July 21st (and comparing to July 2023), the zone has 4173 members (220 more than in 2023), 51 clubs (4 more than in 2023) and 55 workout groups within some of the clubs. Snake River is the smallest LMSC with 129 members and (98 in 2023). Pacific Northwest is the largest with 1718 members (1,659 in 2023). The Zone publishes a newsletter four times a year. It is posted on the Zone website - www.northwestzone.org.

# **Discussions and Projects Since Last Annual Meeting**

- 1. 17 zone delegates arrived a day early in Houston, TX for the 2023 USMS Annual Meeting. The group met for dinner, held a meeting the following morning, and lunched with members who held similar positions. All agreed it was worth the extra hotel/meal expense and was time well spent.
- Bids were submitted and accepted for three NW Zone Championships, which were held in Caldwell, ID (OW at Broadside Harbor Ski Lakes June 29) and Federal Way, WA (LCM July 6&7). The SCM champs will also be in Federal way November 23&24.
- 3. Webmaster Dave Cabrey (IW) continues to keep the northwest zone website current. It was decided to archive NW Zone Chatters (newsletters) on the website.
- 4. Records in SCY, SCM and LCM are kept up to date by Steve Darnell (OR). After Steve records any new records, they are then posted to the website.
- 5. An effort was made to better connect the webmasters so the various events within the zone could be shared on websites and social media. The membership coordinators in the zone's LMSCs were encouraged to mentor each other as well.
- 6. The Zone discussed their concerns that the USMS committee members were not included in this year's Rule Book.
- 7. The Zone collects membership surcharges of \$.50/swimmer as of 5/1 of each year. These funds have been billed and collected for 2024 and the June account balance was

\$8659.92. The smaller LMSCs were encouraged to request use of the zone's account to support attendance at the USMS Volunteer Relay and National Coaches Clinic.

- 8. OR submitted a proposal to the USMS Legislation committee that would codify in the USMS Rule Book that USMS Board of Directors' meetings would be "open to non-BOD members who are USMS members" who can listen, but not contribute. Numerous other LMSCs have signed on to endorse the proposal.
- 9. PN submitted a proposal to the USMS Legislation committee that would "require House of Delegate meetings to be held in person on an annual basis (unless an emergency prevents that)".

### Introduction

The Oceana Zone includes the Pacific and Hawaii LMSCs. From one end to the other the zone is over 2,700 miles, the greatest end to end distance of any zone. The zone committee meets annually during the USMS Annual Meeting and conducts other business, as needed, by phone, email or a virtual program such as Zoom. This year, as in 2023, the meeting will be conducted on a virtual (Zoom) platform as part of the 2024 USMS Annual meeting.

### **Discussions and Projects Since Last Annual Meeting**

- 1. As of 8/1/2024 there are 9,406 USMS members in the Pacific LMSC compared with 10,153 members at the same point in 2023 (a slight decrease of approximately 7%). In Hawaii, as of 8/1/2024 there are 545 USMS members compared with 575 members at the same point in 2023 (a decrease of approximately 5%).
- 2. **Pacific LMSC**: Pacific hosted a full schedule of pool events as well as open water events. We will be hosting a Level 2 and Level 3 Coaches Certification clinic in late September, as well as a stroke development clinic. We are finalizing the program for our Annual Celebration in November.
- 3. Hawaii LMSC: The Hawaii LMSC has been busy. Bylaws have been updated and the draft is being reviewed by members. The bylaws will be voted on at the upcoming Annual Meeting scheduled to take place over Zoom in late August. We have sent out several newsletters to all members this year. The LMSC will be hosting several clinics (stroke development, Coaches Certification Level 2 and Level 3, and ALTS Instructor certification), free to all Hawaii LMSC members during Labor Day weekend on Maui. The LMSC will be providing \$200 stipends available to those who are traveling from neighbor islands for up to 15 LMSC members.

The LMSC continues to look for ways to support local clubs and events by providing grants to clubs and funding for swim meets. In 2023, we distributed about \$20,000 in grants to local clubs to help them restart after Covid. The grant amounts available to each club were pro-rated based on the number of registered USMS swimmers in each club. Clubs are encouraged to submit proposals for swim events and the LMSC is looking for support to help run swim meets. Our Lahaina club is not back in the pool and the LMSC is looking for ways to help.
