Discussions and Projects Since Last Annual Meeting

- 1. Zone Communications
 - a. The zone chair fielded questions from and checked in with LMSC officers, emailed them and HOD delegates occasional reminders and updates, and sent zone-wide e-newsletters about upcoming <u>programs</u> and <u>events</u>.
 - b. The zone chair, vice chair, and LMSC officers from NE, DV, PV, and NJ coordinated with each other and facility reps to plan and host zone championships and discuss potential future meet venues.
 - c. Coordinated July meeting of LMSC reps with USMS BOD members.
- 2. Webmaster Ray Novitske maintained the zone website.
- 3. Recorder Chris Stevenson updated <u>zone records files</u> for each course.
- 4. Maintained the Colonies Zone Facebook Group.
- 5. Zone Championships: 2024-2025 Season Recap
 - a. SCM: December 13-15, 2024, Worcester Polytechnic Institute (MA). 371 registered swimmers & 53 teams in 2024 vs 306 & 53 in 2023, 300 & 46 in 2022, and 216 & 40 in 2021. The Saturday session was suspended for 90

- minutes due to a heart attack. The swimmer survived thanks to the quick response of the facility staff and an ER physician who was participating in the meet. The 2024 meet lost money partly due to paying lane timers, which was a consequence of holding the meet during college final exams.
- b. SCY: March 15 & 21-23, 2025, Harvard University (Boston, MA). 662 registered swimmers & 69 teams in 2025 vs 285 & 57 in 2024 at JRSSC (VA) in 2024, 225 & 48 at Rutgers (NJ) in 2023, and 298 & 38 at WPI (MA) in 2022. The 2025 meet made a slight profit.
- c. LCM: The zone chair, vice chair, and NJ LMSC officers met with club and facility reps to discuss <u>Jersey Aquatic Center</u> hosting a zone championship. The facility opted to initially run this new LCM meet as a sanctioned non-championship event but subsequently canceled it due to low enrollment.
- 6. Zone Championships: 2025-2026 Season Preview
 - a. SCM: WPI (the usual meet venue) and other championship-caliber SCM venues in New England are not available this fall, with the possible but increasingly unlikely exception of <u>Boston University Aquatics Center</u>. Besides BU, LMSC officers are pursuing <u>Nassau County Aquatic Center</u> in Long Island and <u>Graham Aquatic Center</u> in York, PA, the status of which is TBD. The <u>Union College pool</u> in Schenectady, NY, is also a possibility but is geographically remote. Potential dates: Nov. 15-17, Dec. 5-7 or 12-14.
 - b. SCY: April 10-12, 2026, Jim McKay Natatorium, George Mason University, Fairfax, VA. Co-hosted by meet beneficiary GMU Swimming & Diving and the PV LMSC. Goals: 400+ swimmers and \$10K profit for the varsity coach to consider hosting this meet annually and reestablish our 17-year prepandemic zone championship tradition at GMU.

Introduction

Listed below are the reports from each LMSC within the Great Lakes Zone.

Allegheny Mountain - Libby Ernharth, LMSC Chair

- 1. Membership at this moment in 2025 is 524 which is excellent for August 1 as annual memberships for most teams will have a fall registration which often attracts new members. Last year we closed at 545 swimmers and reported only 454 at the meeting at this time last season. We are growing.
- 2. Clubs: 10
- 3. Meets/ open water events since last annual meeting: 3 regular meets (2 MLAC, one FFH); but co-hosted Tidal Meet at Spire with two other LMSCs !! BRAND NEW, BIG DEAL. Swimmers at Nationals again.
- 4. No new ALTS instructors
- 5. Try Masters Month- FFH hosted in July (unable to extend TMM into August due to their registration-- it is too much. Request offer July only for TMM).
- 6. 2024 Relay/ National sent one to relay only. 2025 Relay- sending 2; National Conference 1
- 7. Budget 2024: planned for 4861 deficit, only had 2780 actual deficit.
- 8. Activities: 5K, assistance for Tidal Wave Meet, sauna/cold plunge event (no current social chair)
- 9. Successes: Have increased board activity, succession planned, will have social chairs as of new elections (Current chair has volunteered). Have a new website! Have fostered YMCA relationship and coordination as able for these few meets that are USMS. Will start the year for the first time ever with three scheduled (not yet sanctioned etc) meets through early March. Record attendance for each meet in the 2024-2025 season. Work with the amazing Ann Marshfield for the Tidal Wave meet (AMS didn't expect to recoup all investment \$).
- 10. News: Three in LMSC leadership (Judy Caves open water chair, Jenn Petyk treasurer and Libby Ernharth chair- with Justin Dutta) participate in a 5 mile charity swim and raised >10k for local cancer charity-Cancer Bridges-- and swam 5 miles on their

- Monongahela river Saturday 8/2. The swim attracted a lot of media attention (something uncommon for the AMS area and masters swimming!).
- 11. Frustrations: Heat and warm pools. Interested if anyone has experience with the water cannon or cooling pool strategies (this is outdoor summer pools...). All of the regional pools have been retaining heat and specifically FFH have been looking into options and wondered if there was any expertise/advice from non-south areas with seasonal outdoor pools that are heating up more these past few years....
- 12. Goals: Spend more money on members in the coming year. A social chair will help. Considering a free or much reduced clinic with dinner in February.

Illinois - Molly Hoover, LMSC Chair

- 1. Total Membership: 1953
- 2. How Many Clubs: 19 clubs and 25 workout groups
- 3. Swim Meets: 12 meets were held from October 2024-July 2025
- 4. Open Water: 5 open water swims are either sanctioned or recognized by USMS in 2025
- 5. Community events off the pool deck: We held 1 Coaches Clinic in Joliet led by 2 board members who attended the National Coaches Clinic in October of 2024. This included classroom and in-water work and culminated with a social provided by the board at a local restaurant. At least one more coaches clinic is being planned by the end of the year. We also held our annual social after the Saturday session of the state meet. This is where our annual awards are handed out, Hall of Fame announced, and food and drink is provided. This event was attended by about 200 people.
- 6. Financial health: as of July, 2025, \$20,400 in the bank and \$285,000 in investments
- 7. Volunteers: Steady, dedicated volunteers are still going strong. We have brought on new board members or new roles to current members over the last year to fill vacancies.
- 8. We are excited to bring a full slate of in-person delegates to the Annual Meeting in Kansas City. At this time, we are also working to finalize delegates for the USMS Relay in October.
- 9. Ideas/Goals for 2026: Focus on helping teams who have the capabilities to run an ALTS program (certified instructors, pool space) get it off the ground. We often have coaches interested in the certification but then don't actually start an ALTS program. Continue to work on spending down our surplus for the good of the LMSC. We have voted to help subsidize all meets including our state meet as a benefit to our competitive members. We also want to find ways to use our surplus to benefit those who don't compete.

The <u>2025 Ohio SCY Masters State Championship Meet</u> was the single largest one day Masters swim meet in the LMSC with 171 swimmers. This meet is co-hosted by Ohio LMSC and Lake Erie LMSC

The <u>2025 Tri-State Tidal Wave LCM Masters Meet</u> was the first LCM Masters swim meet with three LMSCs providing seed money. 151 swimmers, 35 clubs, 11 LMSCs and 1 swimmer from CCS.

- LE LMSC pays for pool rental and coaches for continued outdoor practices at the Avon Aquatic Center. All USMS registered members are welcome. Cost is \$10 drop in. Practices are held on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays.
- 4. Financial health: LE LMSC attempts to spend down its reserves by investing in the Ohio SCY Masters State Championship Meet, the Tri-State Tidal Wave Masters Meet and the outdoor September practices. We also pay the basic USMS membership (\$75 value) for our LMSC board members, pay for club renewals, and offer prizes of USMS membership (\$75 value) at our annual meeting. The LMSC has \$36,000+ in the bank.
- 5. Relay 2025: We will send 3 coaches to Relay 2025
- 6. Projects include updating LE LMSC By-Laws to align with Ohio Code of Regulations and creating a policy document for guidance of board decisions and their implementation.

Introduction

The Northwest Zone covers an area of 1,175,954 square miles (about twice the area of Alaska), which includes all of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah and Washington, and 3 counties in Nevada. There are seven LMSCs, as Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and parts of Nevada are combined to form Inland Northwest (IW), Oregon (OR), Pacific Northwest (PN), and Snake River (SR) LMSCs.

The NW Zone currently lists 85 USMS members serving on the LMSC's leadership teams. The board conducts Zoom calls in December, March, June, and prior to the USMS Annual Meeting. Meeting minutes are posted on the NW Zone and USMS websites. 17 zone members are expected to attend in person, and 5 others will attend virtually for a total of 22. As of July 31, the zone has 4,422 members and 55 clubs. Snake River is the smallest LMSC with 123 members, and Pacific Northwest is the largest with 1,838 members. Introduction

Welcome to the 2025 South Central Zone Annual Meeting. The South Central Zone includes the following LMSCs: Arkansas, Gulf, North Texas, Oklahoma and South Texas.
