We managed a pandemic together by meeting for virtual workouts, virtual game nights, outdoor dryland workouts and very early season open water swimming for the more adventurous.

The lifelong friends I've made and the comfort level I have as soon as I walk on a pool deck is a direct effect of being a part of USMS. The quality of community and the enhancements they have led to in my life are a direct result showing how being a member of USMS has improved my life!

How do you know the candidate?

Crystie McGrail is a trusted governance partner and friend whom I first met in 2011 and worked closely with on the New England LMSC board from 2013 to 2022. We have jointly attended NELMSC events, USMS annual meetings, the National Coaches Clinic, and the Volunteer Relay. Since she moved to Colorado, we have continued to collaborate on USMS initiatives. I chair the LMSC Development Committee and the Colonies Zone, while Crystie, as vice president of local operations, serves as an ex officio member of the committee and liaison to the USMS board.

What makes this person a good candidate for this position? What skills, experiences, or attributes do they bring that will contribute to the success of USMS in this role?

Since joining USMS in 2009, Crystie McGrail has consistently excelled in numerous roles — coaching and managing Great Bay Masters in New Hampshire and Longmont Masters in Colorado, directing mini meets and large LMSC championships, and serving in various local and national governance positions. Her leadership and many contributions have been recognized with honors and awards, including her 2023 induction into the New England LMSC Hall of Fame.

Crystie is an effective planner and communicator who does her homework, seeks input from others, and is quick to learn. She asserts her perspective directly but respectfully, and her collaborative approach and incisive questions are valuable assets. When disagreements arise, she remains constructive and solution oriented.

Crystie initially volunteered to support the New England LMSC board as webmaster in 2013. When she

became coaches chair in 2014, she immediately introduced well-considered proposals with a clear plan, budget, and goals to educate and energize New England's coaches. When she succeeded me as board chair in 2019, the transition was seamless due to her preparation and engagement.

As NELMSC board chair from 2019 to 2021, Crystie addressed issues and challenges with her usual methodical, value-added approach. This modus operandi served us well when we voluntarily adopted the USMS Unified Fee without incident by clearly communicating the reasoning to members. It also helped during the pandemic, when we circulated reliable information, provided useful open water swimming and dryland training resources, and thoughtfully implemented a club and workout group grant program.

Crystie is continually learning, leading, and lending support. She has attended annual meetings, local and national coaches clinics, and the Volunteer Relay, which she has helped plan. Her service on the Coaches, LMSC Development, and Governance committees and current role as vice president of local operations has enabled her to align best practices with USMS's strategic priorities. She has also "walked the walk" by personally participating and helping implement USMS initiatives at the local level, including meets, certification courses, clinics, and Adult Learn to Swim and Grown Up Swimming programs.

In summary, Crystie consistently demonstrates professionalism, thoughtfulness, and effectiveness, and her proactive approach and commitment to continuous improvement position her to help guide USMS through future opportunities and challenges.
