


College Club Swimming History


Mission: To promote fitness, camaraderie & competition for college students through swimming.

- 2016: First Advisory Board meeting; creation of Governance Handbook
- 2017: Initial CCS club & member registration
- 2018: First official CCS Nationals at Georgia Tech
- 2019: USMS Bridge Membership launched (CCS LMSC)
- 2020: What did CCS do during COVID?
- CCS & USMS meets: UB Fall Invite (University of Buffalo), Buff Invite (University of Colorado Boulder), Rhody Invite (University of Rhode Island)
- How does the CCS mission align with USMS?

CCS-USMS Collaboration: Spotlight on New England LMSC

2023 Rhody College Club & Masters Swimming Meet

- Co-hosted by URI Swim Club & NELMSC at URI
- 365 swimmers (61% CCS, 39% USMS) in coed heats
- 9 CCS clubs, 21 USMS teams

2024 New England College Club & Masters Swimming Meet

- November 2 at Boston University
- Evolution of Rhody Meet at larger, more centralized venue
- Target: 500 swimmers (50% CCS, 50% USMS)

Goal

 Promote CCS & USMS guiding principles by fostering camaraderie via friendly competition among college club and Masters swimmers











Rhody CCS-USMS Meet: Year One Takeaways

Deck atmosphere — swim meet or dance party?

- More energy! More passion! More music!
- Helps to have experienced officials skilled at engaging with younger and older swimmers
- Branding and promotional support from USMS and NELMSC

Positive meet outcomes

- Fundraising opportunity for URI Swim Club
- Enhances brand affinity, provides proof of concept and a template for future combined meets
- UVM Swim Club subsequently invited a Masters team to its mini meet in Burlington, VT
- CCS swimmers participating at LMSC, Zone, and USMS national championships

CCS-USMS collaboration

- URISC secured the pool, communicated with CCS teams, and recruited meet volunteers
- NELMSC managed budget, Club Assistant & Hy-Tek, and communicated with Masters swimmers
- CCS & USMS teams/leaders have different challenges and needs but can help each other
